As the new year school year begins, Freshman Parent Night is a great opportunity for you to come and meet your student's, teachers, administrative team and other staff members. This begins at 6pm in the auditorium, directly after at 7pm is Open House, you will be able to follow your student's schedule and meet their teachers. This takes place prior to the Open House scheduled for the night. There will also be an Activities and Clubs Showcase, where you will be able to learn more of different opportunities for your student.

Things to remember:

New Electronic Device Policy: Our goal at CHS is always to maintain a distraction free, academic environment at all times. With this in mind, the use of electronic devices such as (but not limited to) cell phones and earbuds is prohibited during instructional time. Smart watches and similar wearable devices should be placed in airplane or school mode. The expectation is that all students will have these devices put away during instructional time unless the teacher has given permission for use in a specific instructional activity. Students who violate the personal electronic device expectations will be subject to progressive disciplinary consequences including, but not limited to, loss of privileges.

- Electronic devices should not be out or visible during instructional time. Note:instructional
 time is defined as all scheduled class time (bell to bell) inclusive of breaks and
 club/organizational meetings during Greyhound Time.
- Electronic devices should be stored in the classroom organizer provided or in a backpack.
- If the device is not put away appropriately, the device will be confiscated and turned over to a grade level administrator who will keep the device until the end of the day. Parents will be notified by the teacher.
- Repeat offenses will result in disciplinary consequences and possible loss of device privileges at school.
- Failure to comply with teacher directives will result in additional disciplinary consequences.
- If permission is given by the teacher for use of a personal electronic device, the teacher
 will clearly identify the parameters for use of the device in the instructional activity.
 Note: Devices should not be used for recreational purposes during any instructional time.



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Attendance:

- Showing up daily is essential for success, instructional time is hard to duplicate with the natural environment, questions and activities.
- If a student does not feel well, or has an illness/injury or needs a day to recoup, be sure to contact teachers of the missed class/courses to stay current with missed work, content and class. **You can ALWAYS email me directly to let me know as well, I will work to help you transition back into the classroom.
- Use Greyhound the following day to follow up with teachers for any questions or concerns
- Finally and most importantly, the attendance percentage will be on the students' official transcript.

Beginning next week, if a student would like to change their schedule, they will need to complete the Blue form and retain all signatures prior to returning it to counseling. We will conclude schedule changes at the end of next week.
