

PRACTICAL ARTS - BUSINESS

Course offerings in business are designed to acquaint students with the business community and to prepare them to communicate effectively with the business world. Courses are designed to improve students' skills in areas of business and to increase their capabilities as consumers. No sequence of courses is required.

INTRODUCTION TO BUSINESS

9th – 12th Grade Credit – 1/2 Semester 1

This course will help students to improve their economic citizenship by gaining a knowledge and appreciation of the American enterprise system. They will make wise and skilled decisions in selecting and using goods and services of businesses, and develop competency and efficiency in managing their personal and business financial affairs. Through the use of various activities such as discussions, simulations, technology, and peer collaboration, students are made aware of the integral role they play in today's society. Key units will focus on the global economic environment, business organization and management, social responsibility, entrepreneurship, marketing, operations, and technology.

REMEMBER! WORLD LANGUAGE AND SUPPORT CLASSES ARE ELECTIVES

ZERO HOURS

- → A zero hour is a class that meets <u>outside</u> of the 8 period school day
- → On the green Course Offerings sheet the **zero hours** will be indicated with ##
- → These classes are taken for **credit** and a **grade**
- → Some classes meet <u>daily before school</u> and others *once a* week with lunch meetings
- → Music and performance zero hour classes are by audition n the fall and will be added to the schedule
- → <u>Forensics</u> (Speech and Debate) can be taken as a **zero hour** class or a student can participate in the activity without being enrolled in a class
