## Free Peer Tutoring Available Through National Honor Society

We are pleased to announce that our National Honor Society members are once again offering free peer tutoring in MATH, SCIENCE, and WORLD LANGUAGES for the current semester. Program Benefits: Students who have participated in our peer tutoring program in previous years have experienced notable improvements in their academic performance. Many have seen significant grade increases and, equally important, have developed greater confidence in subjects they once found challenging.

Program Details: Our NHS students volunteer their time and expertise to help their peers succeed. To ensure the program runs smoothly for everyone involved:

- Your child will be paired with one tutor, who will coordinate tutoring sessions with your child.
- On average, your child will have one tutoring session per week.
- As best they can, tutors will be communicating with your child's teacher to make sessions as effective as possible.
- Tutoring sessions will be held during Greyhound Time.
- IMPORTANT- Your student is encouraged to take ownership of their learning by attending all scheduled sessions. Our tutors will do their best to encourage your child to attend tutoring sessions, but ultimately it is your child's responsibility to attend tutoring sessions.
- Students who do not regularly attend tutoring will be dropped.
- IMPORTANT- Families may NOT reach out to tutors directly. If you have questions, please contact Mrs. Carroll Lehnhoff-Bell, one of the NHS faculty advisors.

## **Cultural Leadership Apps are Open!**

#### **The Organization**

LEAD STL is a local student leadership organization committed to developing high school, middle school, and college-aged students from across Greater St. Louis into leaders and changemakers within their communities. We do this through immersive learning, leadership development, and empathy building rooted in the Black and Jewish experiences, using them as frameworks through which to explore many other identities and communities. Students don't have to be Black and/or Jewish to participate in programming as we value a diversity of voices and backgrounds in all of our programming. Students are trained how to have tough but

important conversations with each other about racism, antisemitism, homophobia, and many other forms of inequities and injustices so they can benefit their schools and communities.

#### **The Program**

<u>Cultural Leadership</u> is a year-long fellowship for Sophomores and Juniors starting December '25 where students meet monthly on Sunday afternoons in locations across the St. Louis region to talk about issues important to them, develop leadership skills, and build meaningful relationships with each other. Additionally, students participate in three overnight retreats in St. Louis and embark on a 2-week Transformational Journey in June where they travel across the East Coast and South, visiting sites and meeting with individuals significant to Black and Jewish history and culture as well as social change movements.
