From the Principal

February is frequently referred to by educators as the "longest month." Teachers and students start to tire of winter and look forward to a spring that is not quite here yet. The weather has been especially challenging for establishing a consistent school routine. It has been a long time since we have had to use four snow days and an early release snow day in the same year much less the same month. Thank you for your understanding and flexibility as we work to keep our students and staff safe. After the snow day this week we will officially be out of snow days for the year, and any subsequent snow days will be virtual days with students working remotely. Hopefully that will be unnecessary, but you never know...

While you wouldn't know it by looking outside, spring sports begin next week, which is an indicator that third quarter is coming to an end. At this time of year my mindset shifts to all of the end of the year events which always seem to line up a few weeks apart. For the remainder of the year it seems like we are continually preparing for the next event. For example, next week we have SAT/PSAT testing, then parent-teacher conferences, followed by spring break, followed by End of Course exams (state testing), followed by the CHS Awards ceremony, then Prom/After-Prom, AP Exams, Senior week and then Graduation.

Once we reach the end of third quarter, the school year seems to accelerate all the way through the end of the year.

Speaking of end of year events, we are excited about the return of some annual school events that were significantly modified or canceled due to COVID the past few years. We plan to have a "normal" Prom at Windows on Washington on April 30. (Plans are still being finalized for After-Prom.) We are also excited to have graduation return to Chaifetz Arena (SLU campus) on May 26 at 7pm. We plan to have a "normal" ceremony that complies with all District and facility guidelines at that time. I am so happy for our kids and especially our seniors that we will be able to celebrate them together as a community.

Finally, we are looking forward to welcoming parents to Parent-Teacher Conferences next month. As we did in the fall, parents will have the option of a conference over Zoom or an in-person conference. All visitors and staff will be required to be masked for in-person conferences. Also, based on feedback from parents and staff we will not be offering late conferences after school hours on the Friday before spring break begins. As a result, we will be offering conference slots on three days as opposed to our usual two days. You will receive a link for conference sign ups next week (March 3). We hope that you will take advantage of this opportunity to connect with our teachers and continue to strengthen our partnership with you.

Kaitlyn has progressed to the second stage of selection after the review of 1,617 Semifinalists who were chosen from among more than 68,000 applicants hoping to be named Coca-Cola Scholars this year.

To become a finalist, high school seniors have made it through an extremely competitive second stage of selection and are participating in regional interviews with a committee of Scholar alumni and staff members. After these interviews are complete, 150 of the 251 Regional Finalists will become Coca-Cola Scholars and receive a \$20,000 scholarship.

Crown nominees are already winners and will receive Silver Crowns. Gold Crown winners will be announced in March 2022.
