Clayton Education Foundation Update by Sandi Streaker:

Sandi is the Executive Director of the Clayton Education Foundation. The Board of the Education Foundation is made up of Clayton alumni. The foundation covers programs not covered by tax dollars that provide innovative learning experiences for students in each of the Claytons schools. Along with fundraising, they support reunions, special events and activities and sponsor the Clayton Alumni Hall of Fame and Distinguished Educator Awards for Clayton teachers. The Clayton Education Foundation sponsors the Teacher Innovation Grants. Applications will be accepted beginning in January. Donations can be made by visiting their website.

Principal's Report:

Parent-teacher conferences are coming up. You will receive an email with SignUpGenius links on Oct. 13. Parents will choose the link to the teacher they want to meet with and follow the information on the SignUpGenius. Some teachers have sent this out already, so you may have already signed up. Please reserve Thursday for in-person conferences only. Due to contact tracing, drop-ins will not be allowed. All other conferences will be through Zoom. Please know that you can schedule a meeting with a teacher at any time, not just during conferences.

Panorama Survey:

The Panorama Survey is a research-based student perception survey that collects feedback data for teachers and school administrators. The Panorama Student Survey measures student perceptions of teaching and learning, culture and climate, and student experience in the classroom and school. Student perceptions of their classroom experience helps identify a teacher's strengths and areas for teacher growth.

One of the areas showing up at Wydown was the students' sense of belonging. Our counselors will be diving deeper with focus groups. The school culture is shifting. There is a social gap. We need to get kids more involved, and to learn how to socialize in a class. Our PACK times will be focusing on this with some intentional work. There was talk about earning points for items in a school store. (School store would be manned by a parent volunteer once a week.) Points would be earned by attending sports activities, after school activities, plays, etc., including Zoom activities for those students not in the district. Devising a way for students to earn points and feel a sense of belonging. Points could also go toward the purchase of a yearbook, etc. Looking at what we can plan for the spring to help bridge the gap for trips and camps that have been cancelled.
