Treasurers report: Amber K. We received another \$1,000 in Funds for Excellence Donations, making the total donated this school year \$16.5 k, which while not at our goal is almost double what we have received in years passed. Correction made to last months report that \$35 was amount spent allocated to teacher luncheon, not \$350.

Brought up the need to Change the name of Funds for Excellence. Confusing because it is different at each school. Need to sort it out so that all schools are on the same page.

Principals report. Fun Fest had 385 students, which is over 2/3 of the school. Out of all those kids being here, we had very few discipline problems. We couldn't have done it without the PTO and parents, there were 29 parents there to help. 15 Teachers also, couldn't have don't it without the staff and custodians. A great team effort.

December is a busy month with a lot of good things going on. Theater works performance is tonight, that is the new name for integrated arts class. Tomorrow night is the band night at 560 Music Center in the Loop. All bands perform, middle school and high school. Thursday is STEAM night, challenger learning center from Wash U.

We are going to be holding town hall meetings with kids, put info in the newsletter and working with parents as teachers. Goal is to teach empathy and how do we reinvent the importance of being kind to each other?
