- 3. Principal's Report Dan Gutchewsky
 - CHS named National Blue Ribbon School. Very few schools have been named multiple times. Recognition Ceremony is virtual in early December. Looks at test scores for qualifier, then application.
 - Board approved change to calendar to move PT Conferences back to November. They
 will be virtual. Teachers will have more opportunities in professional learning about
 returning to hybrid learning.
 - Due to Sam Page's announcement, football will be played in the county. First game Friday night. Each player gets 2 pre-approved spectators. May be only home football game this season. Two more are away, then playoffs.
 - Softball season moved to spring.
 - All other fall sports are able to play right now.
 - Finalizing details on performing arts groups doing a Halloween themed event in Shaw Park in November.

 - Focus has been getting youngest learners in the buildings first. Then middle school students in next. Secondary students still have high transmission rates. Information will be released as soon as it is known.

 - I have been doing equity work within my past positions in Parkway and Rockwood as a teacher and administrator. I never had a teacher that looked like me. I want to be the change I want the kids to see. It's important to change the narrative and stereotypes, and have that experience. I want to be an advocate for kids who don't fit the ideal mold.
- 6. Clayton Education Foundation Report Sandi Straetker
 - Joined in mid February as new director. Prior to that was independent public relations. Also a Clayton schools mom. Excited to participate in the community by leading the foundation. Created by alumni in 2009. Made up by a board of diverse group of Clayton alumni very committed to the district. Fund classroom initiatives and innovation. Signature program is teacher innovation grants. Supports creativity in the classrooms. Last year gave out \$65,000 in grants across the schools. Host Clayton Hall of Fame and Distinguished Educator Awards. Support scholarships for family center. Support projects like renovations. Support reunions and social events. Scholarship to a Clayton Senior (raffle). Support food pantry, grocery gift cards, fill the backpack program.
 - Question:
 - O Was the scholarship for 2020 graduates a one time event? Will you do that ongoing for 4 years with each class? (Jeffrey Lewis)
 - That is the intent, but need to raise the money for funding it. It is a good way to connect with the students and get their contact info.

- O I wonder if we can establish a scholarship foundation with you and CHS. (Beth Deutsch)
 - Yes, absolutely.
