Superintendent Council Meeting: Celeste Gillette

- The Superintendent has an advisory council made up of the PTO Presidents. Below are highlights from a recent meeting:
 - On April 11, Director of Student Services is hosting a speaker, Mark Norwine (Walking Man) who walked across Missouri to raise awareness for Mental Health. The event will feature a Mental Health Resource Fair from 6-7 p.m., a screening of "[Walking Man.](#)" a documentary about mental health advocate Mark Norwine's 200-mile walk across Missouri to bring awareness to the issue of mental health, and the opportunity to participate in a question and answer session with Norwine. Juniors and Seniors also will be seeing it during the day.
 - The PTO Council discussed factors that indicate a successful graduate
 - A variety of parenting programs are offered through the Clayton Family Center.
