**Go to library website**, click on online databases on left menu.

# For Literary Criticism and biographical information search:

# **American Writers Online**

Type in your author in the search box.

You will see the type of articles in each of the books (ex: critical essay or biography or both). Click on title to read or download the article.

You can highlight and take notes by logging onto your Google account and creating your own folder of highlights and notes.

#### **Gale Literary Criticism Online**

Search by person for biographical information or broad search results to begin.

Search "Name of work" for literary criticism only on specific titles.

Once you select an article, you can click on "download" in right-hand menu to get a readable page view.

The original print source for the article will be in italics below the article title.

You may export citation to Noodletools or your Google Drive by clicking on "citation tools" link.

## **JSTOR**

Select Advanced Search

For a certain novel/work, type in title of work using quotation marks and then select "item title" or "full-text" to the right of search box. Or type in author's name in quotation marks and select "item title" or "full-text." DO NOT select "author" or you'll get articles written BY your author, NOT about your author.

Check article only box. Language: English.

You may also manipulate your results by selecting "full-text" to expand number of results if "item title" results in too few.. Another way to do this is select specific journal types from list below search boxes.

#### **NoodleTools**

Click on sign-in with Google and use your school account. Do this while on campus in order to access account at home.

Type in school username and password then create your own log-in username and password. Create a new project using MLA Advanced.

Use online notecards to annotate and paraphrase your lit crits and biographical articles.

Create citations using "sources" tab. Export from some databases automatically to Noodletools if option available. Create original citations for books (you may import using ISBN).

# **Public Library Databases**

Click on *Database* link on the library's home page

Under topics, click on *Literature* 

Try: Literature Resource Center

After clicking on the link for the database, you will be asked to type in your card number and pin to access the database.

On home page, click on Quick Links

Select Reference and Research

Click on databases

Select MasterFILE under magazines

Type in author of work in basic search; you will find interviews, criticism, short works by author or about work. CLICK on **PDF fulltext** to the left to download full article after reading abstract on main page.
