Grading:

Students will be evaluated using a **variety of assessment techniques**, falling into formative or summative assessment categories.

Criteria	Description
Homework	Homework does not count toward your final grade calculation in CP FST. Homework is given as practice for students to grow, learn, and ask questions.
Formative Assessments	Formative assessments are graded progress checks and quizzes given during class or take-home. These are low-stakes checks to inform teachers, students, and families about progress towards a goal.
Summative Assessments	Summative assessments are graded unit tests that make up most of your final grade calculation in the course. This could be an in-class test or a performance task.
Final Exam	The final exam will include any material from the current semester.

Homework:

- Homework will be assigned **most class meetings**
- Homework will be recorded but will not count toward the final grade.
- Missing homework will not be collected after the unit test.
