 verbs from handout with 3 principal parts

2. Grammar
 - a. Nouns review on pages 226-229 and full charts of endings given in class
 Nominative Singular and Plural
 (of less importance now: Genitive and Dative)
 Accusative Singular and Plural
 in, ex, cum + Ablative Singular and Plural

 - b. Adjectives agree in number and case with noun

 - c. Verbs review on pages 230-235
 Formed from first/second word in dictionary entry:
 Present Tense: -o, -s, -t, -mus, -tis, -nt
 Imperfect Tense: -bam, -bas, -bat, -bamus, -batis, -bant

 Formed from third word in dictionary entry:
 Perfect Tense: -i, -isti, -it, -imus, -istis, -erunt

 - d. Sentence Structure
 Identify subject, verb, direct object, prepositional phrases in English and
 Latin sentences, and know the case for each in Latin.

- Possible question types are multiple choice, true/false or fill in the blank questions asking about grammatical concepts (e.g., “a noun in the _____ case provides the subject of the sentence in Latin”; “the imperfect case is used to describe what kind of past action?”). There will also be questions like choosing the correct form to complete a sentence: “(mater, matri, matres, matrem) filium laudat.”

 You must be able to read sentences and answer comprehension questions and/or accurately translate passages in Latin. Review some stories from each chapter.
