air a mixture of gases that land animals and plants need to live (SRB) alfalfa a type of plant grown in lawns that is used for food by deer and cattle (IG) **animal** a living thing that is not a plant (SRB) basic need something that plants and animals need to survive. Plants need air, water, nutrients, space, and light. Land animals need air, water, food, space, and shelter. (SRB) **behavior** the structures or adaptations that help an organism survive and thrive in its habitat (IG) **blade** a leaf of the grass plant (IG) bud the part of the plant from which new roots and shoots will grow; located at stem nodes (IG) **bulb** a short piece of stem with a bud at one end and roots at the other (IG) **carnivore** an animal that eats other animals for food (SRB, IG) carrot a plant with an edible orange root (IG) combine a machine that cuts wheat and separates the grain (SRB) compare to evaluate one thing against another (IG) **consumer** an organism that cannot make its own food. Consumers eat other organisms. (IG) **cutting** the pieces of stems from an old plant that are used to make new plants (IG) **decompose** to separate or break apart over time (IG) **desert** a dry place with little rain (SRB, IG) **energy** what is gained when an organism eats another organism (IG) eve the node on a potato where a bud grows (IG) fertilizer a chemical that provides nutrients that plants need to grow (IG) **flour** a fine powder made from grinding wheat seeds (SRB) food what plants and animals need to survive (SRB) **food chain** the transfer of energy from organism to organism in a feeding relationship (IG) forest a place with many trees and other plants. Many plants in a forest lose their leaves in fall. (SRB, IG)

garlic a type of bulb that starts growing whenever moisture is provided (IG) grain a hard seed that grows on a wheat plant (SRB, IG) grassland a place with a lot of grass and often no trees (SRB, IG) **habitat** the place or natural area where plants and animals live (SRB, IG) harvest to gather a crop, such as wheat (SRB) **herbivore** an animal that eats plants for food (SRB, IG) interdependent when two things depend on each other for their survival (IG) **lawn** grass-covered land (IG) **leaf** a structure on a plant that is usually green and makes food from sunlight (SRB, IG) **life cycle** the progression of development for plants and animals (IG) **light** one of the basic needs of plants for growth (IG) living alive. All living things have basic needs and produce offspring. (SRB) **map** a special drawing that shows where something is (IG) metamorphosis when an animal's life cycle has different stages, which cause the babies to look different than the parents (IG) **mow** to cut or trim close to the soil; this needs to be done to keep lawns healthy (IG) nest a safe place where animals live and raise their young. Some animals use plants or other animals for nests. (SRB) **node** the place on stems where leaves, twigs, and roots grow (IG) **nutrient** what living things need to grow and stay healthy (SRB, IG) **observe** to watch or study (IG) ocean a saltwater aquatic habitat (IG) offspring a new plant or animal produced by a parent (SRB, IG)

onion a type of bulb that starts growing whenever moisture is provided (IG)

oxygen a gas in air and water that plants and animals need to live (SRB)

parent an adult organism that protects and teaches its offspring (IG)

plant a living that has roots, stems, and leaves. Plants make their own food. (SRB, IG) **pond** a freshwater aquatic habitat (IG) potato an underground stem (IG) predator an animal that hunts and catches other animals for food (SRB, IG) **predict** to draw a conclusion based on observable patterns (IG) **producer** an organism, such as a plant or algae, that makes its own food (IG) **radish** a plant with an edible red root (IG) rain forest a warm, wet place with many trees and other plants (SRB, IG) **root** a part of a plant that grows in soil (SRB, IG) **ryegrass** a type of seed that is used for lawns that is long and pointed (IG) seed a living organism that grows into a plant (IG) **shelter** a safe place where animals live. A shelter protects an animal from weather or other animals.
