Materials for Daily Use In Class

Homework

- Expect daily assignments/quizzes.
- Be prepared to ask questions about your homework the following day. Take note of HW confusions and things of interest. Often, students learn a lot from the questions and comments of other students.
- Always set aside time to study notes, vocabulary, and previous translations as part of your weekly routine (<u>without my reminders</u>).
- Homework may not be checked. The bulk of your grade will be based on quizzes and tests. Expect small quizzes very frequently.

Absences and Tardies

- You have one day of relief per day absent to make up work.
- Email me or ask your friends about what happened when you weren't in class.
- You are expected to take any quiz or test the day you get back. Work out the scheduling with me.
- As per the school policy, two tardies will be permitted per quarter.
 After the third tardy, you will receive a detention. Every tardy thereafter will receive a detention.

Grading

Your quarter grades will be calculated using a total point system.
