#### Bill Verdier Irish Music Scholarship Award Winner

We are excited and proud to announce the 2024 winner of the *Bill Verdier Irish Music Scholarship* award. Congratulations to <u>Stella</u> <u>Bishop</u>, a talented and accomplished young concertina player from St. Louis, Missouri.

Stella told us she first discovered her love for Irish traditional music at age 8, when she was old enough to choose the instrument she wanted to study and chose the concertina. She has

studied at <u>St. Louis Irish Arts</u>, led classes for younger concertina students, attended local sessions, Tionols, and Fleadhs in St. Louis and beyond; in 2023 she competed in the Fleadh Cheoil na hEireann in Mullingar, Ireland. "As I become a more mature musician, I am ready to take my music to the next level ... to increase my repertoire list and knowledge of the concertina, to pass on the knowledge I learn to my students and other members of my community. I hope to continue sharing Irish culture in America and this event will help me do so."



## LEAD STL

#### The Organization

LEAD STL is a local student leadership and social change organization committed to developing high school, middle school, and college-aged students from across Greater St. Louis into civic leaders and changemakers in their communities. We do this through immersive learning, leadership development, and empathy building through the lenses of the Black and Jewish experiences, using them as frameworks through which to explore many other



identities and communities. Students don't have to be Black and/or Jewish to participate in programming as we value a diversity of voices and backgrounds in all of our programming. Students are trained how to have hard conversations with each other about racism, antisemitism, homophobia, and many other forms of inequities and injustices so they can benefit their schools and communities.

#### Cultural Leadership High School Program

<u>Cultural Leadership</u> is a year-long experience for Sophomores and Juniors starting December '24 where students meet monthly on Sunday afternoons in locations across the St. Louis area, engaging in three overnight retreats in St. Louis, and embark on a 3-week Transformational Journey in June across the East Coast and South where they visit sites and meet with individuals significant to Black and Jewish history and culture as well as social justice movements.

#### Program Fee

LEAD STL is committed to ensuring that all families are able to participate in programming, including working with families to remove any financial barriers. We operate on a Sliding Scale Equity System to make sure every family is contributing equitably based on their ability to do so.

## **Clayton Education Foundation Senior Survey**

Our communications department is going to be sending the survey to all the seniors as graduation approaches. This year they will ask for the students non-Clayton email address at the beginning of the survey in the hopes more students fill in their email address. If a student provides this email they will be entered into a drawing to win one of five \$100 gift cards.

## Missouri Assessment Program (MAP)

The Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) is the State's standardized assessment program that provides information on a student's progress toward the Missouri Learning Standards. The State of Missouri requires all public school districts to administer End-of-Course (EOC) exams in Algebra I, English II, Biology, and Government prior to high school graduation. Districts are required to administer these specific assessments at the time that credit is awarded for the course content. If your child will be taking one or more of the required exams this spring you will receive more detailed information from Drew Spiegel within the next few weeks.

## Important Immunization Information and Reminder

Please be aware that all 2024-2025 12th grade students are required to submit proof that a meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV) has been received after the age of 16. This vaccine protects against the bacteria that causes meningitis. It is often administered at the well child check-up after your student has turned 16.

# Documentation regarding this vaccination is required to attend 12th grade and to be eligible to start fall sports.

Your student can receive this vaccine from your regular healthcare provider, any of the St. Louis County Department of Public Health locations and most pharmacies.

# **District News**



#### Math and Literacy Assessments

At the end of each school year, the School District of Clayton gives assessments in both math and literacy to gather data on students and inform instructional decisions.

- Math: In mathematics, students in kindergarten through high school take the NWEA-MAP one to three times a year. The purpose of this assessment is to provide teachers with reliable, instructionally useful data, which can be used to monitor student progress over time. Any questions you have related to mathematics assessments can be directed to the building math specialist/math teacher.
- Literacy: In literacy, we also administer assessments to students in Kindergarten through high school to help inform instructional decisions. Any questions you have related to literacy assessment can be directed to the building reading specialist.

## Social Emotional Learning Surveys Coming Up

Building our social-emotional learning skills continues to be a District goal. Over the next several weeks, students in Grades 3-12 will participate in several surveys to better understand these concepts and to reflect on how they perceive these skills in themselves. We will be asking your child to reflect on their own mindsets and approaches to learning via an online survey they will be completing at school. The survey process should take approximately 20-25 minutes to complete. The survey content will ask students to self-reflect on school climate and environment,

positive/challenging feelings, self efficacy, social awareness, self management, and supportive relationships.

We are asking that all of our students participate in the surveys, as their responses will provide invaluable insights into their experiences and how we can improve and adapt our district to their needs. The responses to these surveys are confidential. However, at times, some responses may warrant further follow up. If a student doesn't feel like they have enough information to answer a question, they will be able to skip the item altogether. If you have any questions about the SEL survey, please don't hesitate to contact your child's counselor or building social worker.
