From the Principal

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Happy New Year!

I hope you had a wonderful summer and you are returning rejuvenated for the new academic year. My wife and I spent the first half of the summer traveling around the East Coast for my son's various lacrosse events. At one point we had been on the road for 22 out of 30 days for various tournaments and showcases. It was really hot for most of the trips but it was still exciting to watch him play. It is hard for my wife and I to believe that we really only have one more summer of these lacrosse experiences and traveling with the other families we have known for years, as Michael is entering his junior year and will be in college before we realize it. We were able to sneak in a short fly fishing trip to Michigan for some non-sports related family time. Despite the grind of the lacrosse schedule, the dedicated time with family always recharges me and it was much appreciated, but the summer seemed to go by way too quickly.

Clayton High School has been a busy place this summer as we hosted summer school and a few minor maintenance and construction projects. We installed new tile and a new audio/visual system in the Commons. Social studies has a completely renovated office area. Stuber Gym has a resurfaced floor and new bleachers. The CHS maintenance team is in the final stages of prepping the building and preparing for the return of students and staff. Our new teachers reported this week and our returning teachers and staff will return next week. I know that they are excited to see all of you.

The CHS Administrative Team has also worked closely with the building leadership group and stakeholders to strengthen our guidelines, procedures and accountability measures for the use of electronic devices and student attendance. We are hopeful that we will be able to build on the progress we made last year in addressing the misuse of electronic devices. Please note that electronic devices should not be visible at any time during instructional time without the expressed permission of the teacher for an instructional purpose. If an electronic device is visible during instructional time, it will be confiscated and turned into an administrator. Repeated violations will result in additional disciplinary consequences. Furthermore, we will be introducing some new measures this year to promote the positive attendance of our students in the college application process by adding daily attendance percentages to student transcripts beginning with the first semester of the 2024-2025 school year. Finally, in order to help address excessive student absences and promote regular in-person attendance, we will institute new procedures that will result in the issuance of a NCA (No Credit-Attendance) grade for any class in which a student accumulates more than eight (8) absences (excused or unexcused) in a class during a semester. We are hopeful that by partnering with families and working together to implement these changes, we will continue to promote and reinforce the positive educational environment we enjoy at CHS. Thank you in advance for your support of these measures.

This spring and summer we added a few new members to our faculty and staff. I am excited about what each of them will bring to the CHS community, and I look forward to their contribution.

What is Greyhound Time?

Clayton High School provides a common time each day to support the academic and personal growth of students. This time may be used in a variety of ways such as academic support (tutoring, reassessment, conferences), club meetings, exercise and mental wellness activities. While students are encouraged to be proactive in meeting their academic needs, teachers may require students to come to office hours for additional assistance. The expectation is that students will prioritize their academic needs during this time. Failure to comply with teacher requests may result in a loss of privileges until their academic obligations are met.
