Please do not hesitate to reach out to a counselor or administrator if your student needs assistance.

Speaking of finals, we will begin our special finals schedule on Wednesday, December 18 and it will continue through Friday, December 20 (insert link). Here are a few reminders about finals expectations:

1. The finals schedule days count as regular attendance days for students.
2. Not all classes will give a cumulative assessment, but they will still have regular classes if not testing.
3. In order to maintain a proper testing environment and avoid distractions for all testers, students will be expected to remain in their respective classrooms for the duration of the

testing periods.

4. If a student has a schedule that causes them to have three assessments in one day, they may request to move one of their finals to a free period, the makeup period on December 20, or one of the makeup testing days during winter break. If a student would like to reschedule one of their exams, they should email their grade level administrator with their request.
5. We will be hosting finals makeup days on December 26, December 27 and January 2, 2025 at 9am in the CHS Commons for any student who misses an assessment during finals week. (Please note that any assessments taken after Jan 3rd will not be included in 1st semester grades.)

If you have any questions, please reach out to your child's grade level administrator or counselor. By working together we can help students maximize their performance while learning to manage their stress in effective ways.

Finally, I want to thank you for your continued support of our work at CHS. We could not do it without you. I wish all of you a restful winter break and a happy holiday season. The Gutchewskys will be spending a lot of time visiting with family locally and relaxing at home. If you are traveling, I wish you safe travels and if you are staying local, I hope you are able to relax and enjoy the time with family and friends. December 6, 2024 from 6pm - 8:30 pm in the CHS Commons.

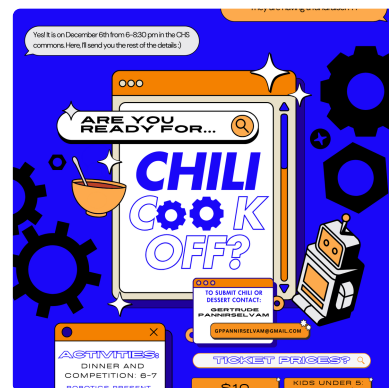

Missouri Assessment Program (MAP)

The Missouri Assessment Program (MAP) is the State's standardized assessment program that provides information on a student's progress toward the Missouri Learning Standards. The State of Missouri requires all public school districts administer End-of-Course (EOC) exams in Algebra I, English II, Biology, and Government prior to high school graduation. Districts are required to administer these specific assessments at the time that credit is awarded for the course content. If your child will be taking one or more of the required exams this winter you will receive more detailed information from Drew Spiegel within the next few weeks.

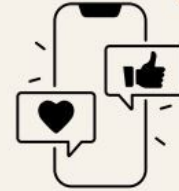
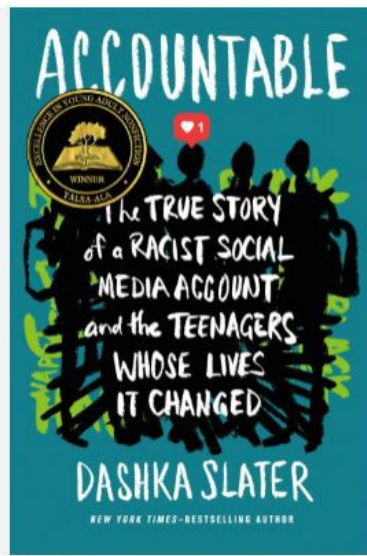
