From the Principal

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Whenever I get frustrated with the state of the country, or for that matter the world, I remember this quote and it gives me hope. In February we take time to celebrate Black History and I always make a point to reflect on the contributions of so many amazing African-American leaders in the history of our country. I especially love the thoughtful words of Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. Each year around this time of year I like to take some time to reflect on the progress we have made to help realize his dream, while also recognizing that we still have much work to do. I prefer to stay optimistic in my world view and embrace the positive whenever possible. Admittedly, it has been a little more challenging to stay positive of late, but I am confident that we are a resilient nation. In the course of my professional interactions with various school stakeholders, I always try to keep in mind that we generally want the same things for our students and school, but we have differences in how we approach these common goals. They performed one of my all-time favorite pieces, "Adagio For Strings" by Barber, and it was amazing. The piece is so powerful and nuanced that it is not approachable for many high school orchestras, but our group absolutely nailed it. A couple of music educators from other Districts came up to tell me

that it was the best high school orchestra performance they had ever seen. Congratulations to our students, Orchestra Director Daniel Henderson, and all of the orchestra teachers on the outstanding performance!

Also last Thursday, I attended the CHS musical production of *Les Miserables* with my wife and my mom. There was a large crowd with many faculty, staff and families in attendance. This production is a personal favorite and I know the musical quite well, so I had very high expectations. The show was amazing! We were all blown away by the talent on display. From the actors/singers, the pit orchestra, the set and technical design, it was all first rate. Congrats to Mallory Duncan (New CHS Drama Teacher/Director and CHS graduate) and company on the outstanding production! CHS theater is in very good hands and I look forward to a very bright future. As a side note, I learned that *Les Mis* was the last show that Mallory performed in as a student at CHS, so her journey has come full circle.

I have been around our performing arts groups for so long that I sometimes forget how fortunate we are to have such talented performers and instructors guiding our students to do amazing things. The time and resources devoted to these opportunities for our students are a testament to the values of the community. Thank you to all of you for your ongoing support of the arts at CHS that enrich the lives of so many and our community as a whole.

Finally, we are in the midst of student course registration for next year and should finish up in the next few weeks. Once we have the registrations complete we will determine staffing levels and start building the master schedule. We should have the master schedule completed by early April, at which time counselors will conduct meetings with each student to resolve any conflicts that arise.
