# From the Principal

This April has provided a huge psychological boost to our school community. The weather has warmed and it is much more pleasant to be outside. We have moved to a mask recommended environment which has allowed students and teachers to see each other's faces for the first time this year. More importantly we have been able to return to the regular annual spring traditions of high schools. This time of year is filled with important milestones for our students. The CHS award ceremony will be in person this year on April 26th. (our apologies, the previous newsletter indicated the 28th which is incorrect) Prom is right around the corner, which will be our first real Prom in over two years. We look forward to celebrating this milestone with our juniors and seniors at Windows on Washington in a little over a week. Advanced Placement (AP) Exams will be administered in person May 2-13. In less than a month we will be celebrating our seniors during Senior Week (May 16-20) with a variety of year end events and festivities that will give us an opportunity to honor them while giving them some additional opportunities to spend time together as a class. Finally, the academic careers of our seniors in the School District of Clayton will come to a close on May 26 at 7pm as we return to Chaifetz Arena (SLU) for Graduation.

We have learned many lessons over the past two years as we have transitioned from inperson learning to remote learning and back again in various configurations. Some of these lessons have been positive while others have not. Some lessons were in the academic realm such as how we can continue to use online learning to meet the diverse learning needs of our students. Other lessons were in the social-emotional realm like the creation of the senior parade (which will become an annual event). One of the lessons that was reinforced during the pandemic was the importance of these milestone events in developing a collective sense of community and class identity. These events represent so much more than silly social events. They represent opportunities to deepen the bonds between our students and the large CHS community. They are crucial to fighting the isolation that plagued so many of our students (and staff) during this pandemic. I am so happy for all of our students but especially our seniors who have had so much of their high school experience disrupted. We are all very excited to celebrate with them in their final month at CHS and I hope that you share our enthusiasm and will join us as you are able.

As I mentioned earlier, we will be returning to Chaifetz Arena on the St. Louis University Campus for an indoor, in-person graduation celebration. This ceremony is an amazing opportunity for our entire school district to celebrate our seniors as they move on to the next stage of their lives. One of the aspects of our ceremony is that we invite the full faculty of CHS as well as all of the other principals from each of our buildings to participate in a truly district-wide celebration. We do this because we recognize that the achievement of our students is not only the result of the staff at CHS but it is a collective effort of the entire District and the larger Clayton community. The event is open to anyone and tickets are not required. I hope that you will consider joining us for this special day. If you can't join us at the ceremony, I hope to see you along the senior parade route on the 20th. :)

## **MISSOURI SCHOOL REQUIRED IMMUNIZATIONS**

Please see the Missouri school immunization requirements for the 2022-23 school year at the link below. Per Missouri state law and School District of Clayton Board of Education policy, all students must present documentation of up-to-date immunization status of each immunization before attending school. Please be aware that a second meningococcal immunization is required before 12th grade unless the first dose was administered to a student who was 16 years of age or older, in which case only one dose is required. At least one dose must be given after 16 years of age. Additional information regarding medical and religious exemptions can be found on the attached link as well.

**New Volunteer Requirements** - In order to ensure we are complying with recent changes to state law, the School District of Clayton has an updated volunteer process. Due to the new statutory requirements, all volunteers that might be alone with students (including field trips), must complete the new background check requirements in order to volunteer in most situations. Any volunteer who has the potential to work alone with students must do the following:

- 1. Complete a volunteer application.
- Authorize the District to conduct a background check through the Family Care Safety Registry. There is a \$15.25 fee to register with the Family Care Safety

Registry. The District will cover this cost.

- 3. Register to have your fingerprints taken. There is a \$41.75 fee to run the fingerprint-based check and the processing time is generally 7-10 days. If the cost of the background check is a burden for your family at this time, please submit your receipt to Cindy Whitney at Central Office.
- 4. Please contact Meredith Reese at 314-854-6038 if you have any questions.
- 5. COVID-19 Dashboard With the decrease in COVID-19 cases throughout the area as well as in the District, we will transition back to updating our COVID-19 Data Dashboard weekly on Friday mornings.
- 6. CHS Volleyball Camp Do you have a third through eighth grader who is looking to sharpen their volleyball skills? If the answer is yes, then be sure to check out the CHS Volleyball Camp.
- 7. Buzz Books Updated School Buzz Books have been updated again and are now available online. - Same Day COVID-19 Testing Program/Partnership District students, parents, and staff can go to any of the locations listed below for walk-in COVID testing (for diagnostics, screening, and travel) and no appointment is needed. This is a pilot program through Visionary Vaccine Services (VVS) available through a partnership between the Clayton, Ladue and Webster Groves school districts. Representatives from VVS will be doing the testing and individuals will receive a letter documenting the date of service, type of testing, and same-day test results.
  - Important details:
    - Masks will be required.
    - Bring identification and insurance card (insurance will be billed for the service).
    - There are no fees for the uninsured.
  - Rapid antigen and PCR testing will be available/accessible daily Monday through Thursday as follows.

**Missouri Scholars 100: Congratulations to Thomas Gustafson** on being selected for the 2022 Missouri Scholars 100, a statewide program that honors 100 of Missouri's top academic students in the graduating class of 2022.



**Coca-Cola Scholars: Congratulations to Kaitlyn Tran** on receiving the Coca-Cola Scholars Foundation scholarship. The mission of the Foundation is to enhance educational opportunities through scholarship awards for young people who demonstrate academic excellence and leadership in their schools and community.

The Coca-Cola Scholars Program is the largest achievement-based and corporate-sponsored scholarship program in the United States. This year, the Foundation reviewed over 68,000 applications and 1,617 were designated as Semifinalists. From these Semifinalists, 250 Regional Finalists were chosen to be interviewed and of those 250, only 150 (less than 1/4th of 1% of applicants) were named Coca-Cola Scholars.

The Chick Evans Scholarship is a full tuition and housing college scholarship for golf caddies and is awarded based on a strong caddie record, excellent academics, and outstanding character.
