Speaking of fall, thank you for your participation in our annual fall Parent Teacher Conferences last week. We had a robust turnout as usual, and it was great to see so many of you in the building last Wednesday. We have continued the practice of providing online and in-person options for conferences, and signups indicate that there is a desire for both formats. (As an aside, the signup data indicates a slight preference for in-person conferences.) Thank you for your willingness to partner with us in support of your students. This partnership is one of the many things that make CHS a special place, and your attendance at conferences is a tangible sign of your support.

Last week, Craig Sucher (Science Teacher) and I were invited to join approximately 45 state legislators at their annual Education Retreat conducted by the Hunt Institute in Columbia, Missouri. It was a very interesting event as we were part of a panel and roundtable discussions answering questions from the state legislators from a practitioner's perspective. Not surprisingly, the legislators have a wide variety of opinions on the solutions to the problems educators face. They discussed testing, open enrollment, equity, the role of AI, and possible solutions to the teacher shortage. I was encouraged by what appeared to be a sincere focus on what educators need to

help students across the state. I appreciated being able to share an educator's perspective while cultivating relationships with the decision makers in our state. The conversations were affirming of the work we are doing at CHS (and the District) and it is clear that Clayton is well respected for the quality of education we provide. Hopefully, we can serve as an ongoing resource for the legislators and use these relationships to help influence the decisions that impact our work with students.

Finally, I'd like to put in a plug this week for our theater department as they will perform our Fall Play, <u>Small Mouth Sounds</u>, on Thursday, Friday and Saturday. They always do an amazing job and I hear they have outdone themselves again! Come check it out!



Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test

On October 22nd, all eleventh grade students will take the online PSAT/NMSQT (Preliminary SAT/National Merit Scholarship Qualifying Test) standardized assessment. Students will need to bring their District provisioned Chromebook to school to use during the administration of the assessment. The PSAT/NMSQT is a part of the SAT Suite of assessments that all Clayton High School students participate in. This assessment is used nationally to determine candidates for the National Merit Scholarship program as well as other scholarship programs. The PSAT/NMSQT, this year is a computer administered assessment in reading, writing, and math. Please contact Drew Spiegel with any questions.

Parent Survey

Starting this week, randomly selected Clayton residents may receive a phone call asking for their thoughts on projects to modernize the District's schools and athletic facilities. The brief survey, which is part of the Long-Range Facilities Master Plan, will help shape priorities for the future. Missed the call? All parents are welcome to share their input by completing this <u>online survey</u>.

Title I Update

Title I is a federal program providing funds to school districts and schools with high percentages of children who are considered disadvantaged. Its overall purpose is to ensure all children have a fair, equal, and significant opportunity to obtain a high-quality education and reach proficiency on challenging state academic achievement standards and assessments. Our building will be receiving Title I funds in 2025-2026.

The School District of Clayton is required to inform you of information that you, according to the Every Student Succeeds Act of 2015 (Public Law 114-95), have the right to know. Upon your request, the School District of Clayton is required to provide to you in a timely manner, the following information:

- Whether your student's teacher has met State qualification and licensing criteria for the grade levels and subject areas in which the teacher provides instruction.
- Whether your student's teacher is teaching under emergency or other provisional status through which State qualification or licensing criteria have been waived.
- Whether your student's teacher is teaching in the field of discipline of the certification of the teacher.
- Whether your child is provided services by paraprofessionals and, if so, their qualifications.

In addition to the information that parents may request, a building receiving Title I.A funds must provide to each individual parent:

- Information on the level of achievement and academic growth of your student, if applicable and available, on each of the State academic assessments required under Title I.A.
- Timely notice that your student has been assigned, or has been taught for 4 or more consecutive weeks by, a teacher who has not met applicable State certification or licensure requirements at the grade level and subject area in which the teacher has been assigned.
